

## Middletown Township Parks and Recreation Board Minutes from June 2, 2025

The meeting was called to order at 6:05 pm by Debbie Marchesani. There was no public comment. Dan made a motion and Debbie seconded to approve of the May minutes and it was approved 6-0.

Joanne gave an update on Summer Rec and Programs: for example, on election day May 20, there were 18 children from five different townships that participated in an archery class. Exercise classes are doing well, and P&R program revenue overall is following budgeted revenue expectations, generally approaching 90% of budget by June 30. For Summer Rec parents, there will be a meet up with the parents on 6/3 to meet the counselors and everyone can pick up their shirts. Also, counselors will have name tags this year, recommended as a 2024 survey result from parents. Pickleball has 350 members and club revenue is similar to 2024 revenue; there are no admin issues with PB to note at this time.

Senior games are 6/5 with pickleball and 6/6 with bocce. The Middletown Community Foundation Golf Outing is on June 23<sup>rd</sup> at Spring Mill Country Club. Movie Night at Community Park is on August 7<sup>th</sup> starting at dusk. Groovin at the Gates in 9/27 from noon to 5 pm and so far, we have 23 vendors participating. The Holiday Open House is scheduled for Thursday, December 11<sup>th</sup> from 5:30 to 8:30 pm.

Construction and Capital Improvements: Patrick informed the P&R Board that the LED at Community Park will start soon. The awarded grant in the amount of \$1 million from the DCED will relamp all four fields soccer fields, five baseball fields and the skatepark, ten fields in total. Armour's work will occur all mid-July and is expected to end by September 1. Besides all new LED lights, all the electrical components on the mechanical room are new as well. This comes with a 25-year warranty.

Meanwhile, Lions Park playground will include new playground equipment and parking spaces. The BOS approved this \$120,000 project at the April 7, 2025, meeting.
