Winter Driving Tips from TMA Bucks Community Traffic Safety Program



Winter weather can quickly bring unexpected poor driving conditions so make sure that both you and your vehicle are ready for ice and snow.

Prior to the winter driving season prepare your vehicle with a winter emergency kit and have a mechanic check your brakes, battery, and belts on your vehicle.

TMA Bucks Community Traffic Safety Program shared their winter driving tips:

- Remove ice and snow from windows, mirrors and all vehicle lights before you drive and as often as needed.
- Remove snow and ice from the hood and roof of your vehicle.Slow down and increase following distance.
- Avoid sudden stops and starts.
- Beware of roads that may look wet, but are actually frozen, often referred to as "black ice."
- Use extra caution on bridges and ramps, where ice can often form without warning.
- Do not use cruise control while driving on snow-covered roads.
- State law requires you to turn on your headlights when your wipers are on.
- Use your low beams in particularly bad weather, especially in cases of heavy or blowing snow.
- Do not pass or get between trucks plowing in a plow line (several trucks plowing side by side).

the 14th anniversary of his passing approaches January 29th. Middletown Township continues to celebrate his life and legacy.


Need a home inspection? Contact the Building and Zoning Department!
