Homeowner Assistance Program Now Open for Families of Four Making Below \$141,750

Homeowners struggling with mortgage payments or other housing expenses due to COVID-19 pandemic-related financial hardships may apply for relief if their household income is at or below 150% of the area median income.

If a **family of four** makes \$141,750 or below, they are eligible for the Homeowner Assistance Program. Eligibility is based on family size and income. Visit the <u>Homeowners Assistance Fund Summary</u> to view the household size charts to determine eligibility.

The Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency has \$350 million in American Rescue Plan funds available to provide eligible homeowners with assistance to prevent and/or ease mortgage delinquencies, defaults, foreclosures, displacement, and utility disconnection. Funds will be distributed directly to lenders, servicers, utility providers, and other authorized third parties (not to homeowners).

# Applications Now Open for the Annual Middletown Community Foundation Scholarship Program

Currently, around 300 smoke detectors have been distributed to residents in the Township since January.

#### Middletown Township Recognizes Cory Hemberger for Heroic Act

The Middletown Township Board of Supervisors recognized local hero and avid hockey player, Cory Hemberger, a 16-year old of Red Rose Gate.

Cory and a friend were practicing hockey on the frozen Lake Afron in Yardley, on Sunday, January 23<sup>rd</sup>, when he overheard a 13-year old boy fall through the ice. Soon after, a second boy fell through the ice.

Despite the risk, Cory sprung into action and rescued the two boys from the freezing lake with his hockey stick.



His quick action resulted in both boys being recused and not needing medical attention. Without Cory's heroism, the outcome of this incident would certainly not have been the same.

Middletown Township Secretary Dawn Quirple applauded Cory for his heroism, "Knowing there are kids out there like you that take the time to put yourself out there with bravery, we are so proud".

The Township wishes Cory well in his future endeavors and want to thank him for his selfless actions that saved the lives of two others.
