Middletown Township Board of Supervisors Join Community Members for Ribbon Cutting at Cobalt Ridge Park

On Wednesday, August 10th, 2022, the Middletown Township Board of Supervisors joined local community members for a ribbon cutting ceremony to celebrate the grand opening of the new playground at Cobalt Ridge Park.

The Department of Public Works broke ground in the beginning of June to replace the 17-year-old playground at Cobalt Ridge Park. This playground is one of a few in the Township that will broaden our inclusive features for children of varying abilities.

The new playground has many features: wheelchair access, solitude seats designed for children on the autism spectrum, a music feature, expression swings with adaptive seating for adults and children to sit face-to-face, plus new benches and trash cans.

"We are pleased to expand our parks for residents with varying abilities," Chairperson Mike Ksiazek said, "It is part of our vision to continue to offer recreation spaces that are accessible to everyone in the community".

"I grew up in Cobalt just a few houses away from the park, so I'm excited that kids of all abilities will be able to play, learn to socialize, and interact with their environment," said Vice Chairperson Anna Payne.

The Cobalt Ridge Park Playground design checks all seven principles of inclusive play that qualifies it as a National Demonstration Site for Inclusion. This means that the playground illustrates community vitality across a variety of influences, including social-emotional, environmental, health, community engagement, public services, and educational opportunities.

Middletown Township Announces Dates for 2022 Road Program



Middletown Township has announced the milling and paving schedule for Middletown Township's Road Improvement Program to be completed by JD Morrissey, Inc. The Road Program is a fourteen-year plan to repave more than 100 miles of Township-owned roads in the community. The contract to complete this work was awarded for \$1.76 million.

Included in the tenth year of the Road Program is the repaving of a parking lot at Twin Oaks Park which will begin on August 22nd, as well as paving of a lot at the Middletown Community Center for pickleball courts which will begin on September 5th.

The milling and paving of the following roadways will begin the week of September 19th:

- · Doublewoods Rd, from Fulling Mill Rd to dead end;
- · Knoll Ave, entire length;
- · Shaw Ave, entire length;
- · Fairhill Ave, from Old Lincoln Highway to dead end;
- Grand Ave, entire length;
- · S Hazel Ave, entire length;
- · Hill St, entire length;
- · Orchard Ave, entire length;
- · Walnut St/Bristol Ave, from parking lot on PFC John Delola Ave to municipal line;
- Dogwood St, entire length;
- · Turtle Ln, entire length;
- · Deer Dr, entire length;
- E Ravine Ave, entire length.
- Eagle Ln, entire length;
- · Pheasant Dr, entire length;
- · Granite Ave, entire length;
- · Forget Me Not Ln, entire length;

The scheduled dates are the current tentative schedule and are subject to change.

Construction is expected to be completed by the fall. Please follow posted signage as crews perform work. In addition to these roads, PennDOT is busy throughout the area repaving state-owned roads.

#### Do You Need a REAL ID?


REAL ID is optional in Pennsylvania, but you'll need a federally-accepted form of ID, like a REAL ID or passport, to fly on a commercial plane or enter secure federal buildings after May 3, 2023.

You will still be able to get a standard driver's license or identification card after May 3, 2023 but will not be able to use it to board commercial flights or enter secure federal buildings.

#### **Help Prevent Mosquitos Around Your Home**



This diagram shows the most common breeding areas for mosquitos around your home.

The <u>Bucks County Department of Health's (BCDH)</u> Disease Vector Control Program works to protect the population of Bucks County from mosquito infestation, nuisance mosquito bites and potential mosquito borne disease through enforcement of the County's Rules and Regulations Pertaining to Disease Vector Control. The Department conducts an extensive mosquito control program during the warmer months of the year.

Residents and property owners can also help prevent mosquito infestations and bites by eliminating standing water which promotes mosquito breeding around their homes.

They can further reduce the threat of mosquito borne disease by using a repellant when going outdoors. Long sleeve shirts and pants can offer protection from bites as well as limiting time outdoors at dawn or dusk when mosquitoes are most active.

#### **Stormwater Sprinkler Tips!**

With the summer heat, you might find yourself using your sprinklers more often. As part of on-going efforts to reduce the effects of polluted stormwater runoff, which is the water you see flowing down

the street when it rains, there is one important reminder:

If you have automatic sprinklers for your lawn, turn them off before leaving for an extended period of time. Most established lawns are happy with one inch of water per week, including rainfall.

If you don't have automatic sprinklers, there are still a few other tips for outdoor watering without waste:

- Adjust sprinklers so that they don't water paved surfaces.
- Don't water in the heat of the day. Watering early in the morning or in the evening

- minimizes the water lost to evaporation.
- Consider using slow-watering techniques such as drip irrigation or soaker hoses. They are considerably more effective than sprinklers at getting the water where it's supposed to be.
