Supervisors Pass Balanced Preliminary 2023 Budget with No Tax Increase



Now Available for Public Inspection



The Middletown Township Board of Supervisors voted Monday, November 14th, to preliminarily approve the 2023 Budget and advertise it for public inspection. The proposed plan includes a balanced General Fund with no proposed tax increase.

The purpose of Middletown Township's budget is for the Board of Supervisors, the Township's governing body, to establish its priorities for the disbursement of funds to accomplish its goals. To the public, the budget describes and details how the Township accumulates and dispenses its resources.

Also included in the budget document is a summary of the Township's organizational and financial goals, goals for each department, and an analysis of the Township's performance management.



The Board of Supervisors is scheduled to consider adoption of the final 2023 Budget at their meeting on Monday, December 12th. The overall 2023 budget is balanced and includes \$38,856,018 in operational expenditures and \$9,074,950 in capital expenditures. Residents are encouraged to <a href="review the budget">review the budget</a> before the next Board of Supervisors meeting on December 12th.

Middletown Township finances have been significantly impacted by the global COVID-19 pandemic over the past two years – initially with significant revenue losses in 2020, followed by the unanticipated influx of more than \$4.7 million in 2021 and 2022 from the American Rescue Plan Act

(ARPA).

In 2022, Middletown Township experienced a strong revenue rebound that can be attributed to higher resident wages and increased development activity in the community with Earned Income Tax, Real Estate Transfer Tax and Permit Fees all tracking higher than anticipated.

The 2023 budget has been prepared in accordance with the Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) criteria to be considered for this award for what will be the fourth consecutive year. # Middletown Township is Hiring a Chief of Fire and Emergency Services



Middletown Township is seeking highly qualified candidates for the position of Chief of Fire and Emergency Services. This newly-created position will continue to ensure our residents receive the best possible fire services.

Middletown Township is served by four local volunteer fire companies: Parkland Fire Company, Penndel Fire Company, William Penn Fire Company, and Langhorne-Middletown Fire Company. The Chief of Fire and Emergency Services will be responsible for the organization and oversight of career and volunteer fire services with week-day daytime fire suppression being provided by paid staff, while evenings and weekends are covered by four fire volunteer fire companies.

Middletown Township conducted a <u>Fire Services Study</u> in 2021 and is working on implementing a <u>Fire Strategic Plan</u>.
