
# Welcome Aboard to New Township Employee

# **Snow Plow Reminders for Winter Weather Safety**


As the cold weather is still here, it is important for residents to be prepared for snow and ice. The Department of Public Works employees work hard to keep our roads and residents safe. By following these reminders, you can help make winter weather easier and safer for everyone:

- Be patient.
- Remove vehicles from the streets within one hour of snow beginning to fall until 12 hours after the snow has ended to avoid being fined.
- Remove basketball nets from the street.
- Do not push shoveled snow

into the street.

 Keep a minimum of 200 feet distance when following a snowplow in your vehicle.
