## 2026 Proposed Budget Now Available for Public Inspection

Middletown Township has released the [proposed 2026 Budget](https://MiddletownBucks.org/2026Budget), now available for public review at [MiddletownBucks.org/2026Budget](https://MiddletownBucks.org/2026Budget). Residents are encouraged to explore the full document to learn more about projected revenues, expenditures, department needs, and the key factors driving the proposed tax changes for the upcoming year.

The Board of Supervisors will consider the proposed budget for final adoption on Monday, December 15 during the regularly scheduled public meeting. Residents are welcome to attend, ask questions, and

provide feedback before the Board votes on the spending plan for 2026.
