Supervisors Advance Projects Supporting Residents' Health and Safety



At their September 8th meeting, the Middletown Township Board of Supervisors addressed a number of important community initiatives. The Board proclaimed September as Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month, raising awareness and showing support for those impacted by the disease.

The Board of Supervisors authorized execution of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) with the Penndel Fire Company for the joint ownership of Tower 8 Fire Apparatus. This partnership helps ensure that critical fire and rescue equipment is maintained and service is readily available to protect residents in both Middletown Township and neighboring communities.

Several community investments were advanced during the meeting, including approval of St. Mary Medical Center's MRI Expansion project, which will enhance local healthcare services. The Board also accepted a \$160,400 Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) to fund 22 new ADA-accessible curb ramps in the Juniper Hill neighborhood. The project was awarded to the lowest bidder, NJS, for a total of \$158,373.75.

Looking forward, the Township is applying for a PennDOT TASA Grant to help close sidewalk gaps along Woodbourne Road between Oxford Valley Mall and Woodbourne Station, further supporting our Multimodal Plan and improving safety and connectivity for pedestrians. The next Board of Supervisors meeting will include a Capital Budget Workshop on Monday, October 6th at 7:00pm at the Middletown Township Municipal Center.


The Municipal Center will be closed on Monday, October 13, 2025, in observance of Columbus Day/Indigenous People Day. In the event of an emergency, please dial 911.
