Do you have old or unwanted tires taking up space in your garage or shed? Middletown Township's Department of Public Works is offering residents a convenient and responsible way to dispose of used tires during the upcoming Used Tire Collection Event.

The event will take place on Saturday, June 6, 2026, from 8:00 AM to 2:00 PM at the Public Works Building, 700 Veterans Highway, Levittown, PA 19056.

Residents may bring passenger car, light truck, and select equipment tires for disposal. Fees will apply based on tire type and quantity.

Tire Disposal Fees:

- Passenger cars & light trucks:
 - \$2.00 per tire (up to 10 tires)
 - \$4.00 per tire (after 10 tires)
- Rim removal:
 - \$2.00 per tire
- Large truck & equipment tires:
 - \$6.00 per tire

Please note: Proof of Middletown Township residency is required to participate.

This event helps residents responsibly dispose of old tires while supporting a cleaner and safer community.
