Residents Who Work in Philadelphia are Asked to Complete Return to Work Survey



In preparation for the gradual restoration of "normal activity" following the COVID-19 pandemic, TMA Bucks and PennDOT are working to get an idea of what commute patterns will look like "post-pandemic" for city-bound workers who live in Bucks County.

In the anonymous online survey, most questions are focused on the use of I-95 including how commuters used the highway during the pandemic, and how much they will be using it through 2022. Other questions include details on where they live, if they telecommute, when

they plan on returning to in-person work, and if they are considering any other means of transportation including SEPTA Regional Rail.

If you are a resident who will be commuting to Philadelphia for work, we encourage you to complete the 11-question survey so TMA Bucks and PennDOT can properly assess commuting patterns.

We Have a New Footbridge!



Last spring, the footbridge across Mill Creek connecting the neighborhoods of Snowball Gate and Forsythia Gate in Levittown was shut down for safety reasons. The footbridge is a valuable asset to locals as it serves a dual purpose for connecting pedestrian access and for recreation in the area.

Our Public Works Crew has been working hard to complete the installation so locals can begin to use the bridge again. They've been working with Contech Engineering Solutions in an effort to reduce costs. Work on the footbridge began in June and was placed on July 22nd, however, the bridge will not be open for use until the walkways on both sides are completed.

The new footbridge is ADA accessible, and will be complete later this summer after ADA accessible pathways are installed at the end of each bridge.

The footbridge improves walkability for residents and increases recreation options for them as well. Supervisor Mike Ksiazek, says "We

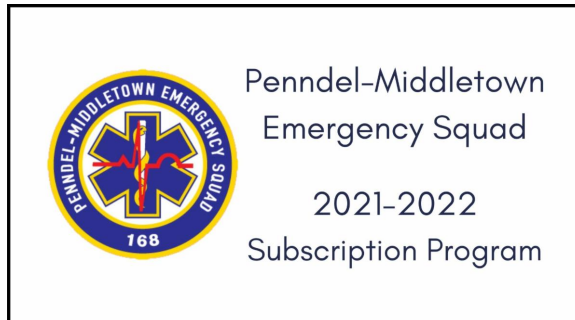
are really excited to be installing a new footbridge for the local residents, and we are looking forward to having it completed for everyone."

Your subscription covers any co-payments or deductibles. In addition, your subscription also assures that you will not incur any unnecessary bills for medically necessary emergency ambulance service to the closest appropriate facility, regardless of your insurance coverage.
